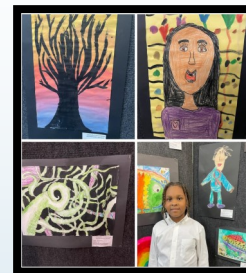
Our Mission

Academic Focus

We anticipate that our students will continue to make educational gains in student achievement. In order to achieve this goal, our school's academic focus can be seen below:

- All kindergarten through fifth grade classrooms are equipped with 1:1 devices. These Chromebooks enhanced educational experiences and student engagement.
- Common formative assessments were used to analyze benchmark data and make instructional decisions to meet the needs of all students.
- Our school targeted foundational reading skills by focusing on the Balanced Literacy Framework, specifically, guided reading and mini-lessons. School-wide quarterly writing days were integrated and student work was highlighted in our Hall of Fame!
- A small group guided math approach was integrated into instruction to improve student-centeredness and differentiation. A school-wide math fact fluency plan was created to increase stamina and achievement in math computation.
