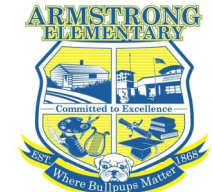

Armstrong Elementary School Accomplishments

Armstrong Elementary provided many opportunities to support the academic success of students. We continued our implementation of Balanced Literacy practices school wide. We also continued our Response to Intervention (RTI) program which supports at-risk readers in kindergarten through second grade. We offer a morning tutorial using IXL, a Battle of the Books Reading Club, and a Morning News Club in third through fifth grade. We continue to support our students with a literacy specialist, and a full-time GT and enrichment educator.

All of the student in grades 3rd-5th are assigned a personalized device to access online educational resources. Throughout the year, student learning experiences are enhanced through the use of various technological tools and programs such as Promethean Boards, English in a Flash, Reading Eggs, Learning A-Z, Reading Counts, Mountain Math, Activ Expressions, internet accessible computers, Chrome books and iPads. We also provide instructional technology using SeeSaw, Google Slides, Google Forms, and Google Classroom.

We incorporate Growth Mindset across the school and within our guidance lessons. The Acting Right program empowers students to take ownership of and be responsible for their own behavior. Two support classes have been added for students with disabilities.

We promote parent involvement including but not inclusive to our Multicultural Event, Student-Led Conferences, Math and Science Carnival, and our Spook-tacular Rocking Reading Event

We implement a school wide positive behavior plan and use regional teams to help build social, word-class, and life-long learning skills.
