








#### **SC READY Performance by Grade Level**

English Language Arts (Reading and Writing)





Participation Rate by Subgroup













#### Percent of ML Students who met progress toward proficiency target




#### **Overall Percentage of Progress Points Earned**



# Student Progress Components - Percent of Progress Points Earned All Students





### **Students meeting Median Annual Targets (MATs)**




Percentage of students meeting Added-Value Targets (AVTs), individual growth targets set to reflect progressive learning gains designed to move students toward proficiency
