OPTIONS TO ENSURE STUDENT SUCCESS



SCHOOL PROGRAMS IN PLACE TO ENSURE STUDENT SUCCESS

- retake one major assessment per guarter. Retaking the assessment is preceded by a re-teaching session by the classroom teacher.
- Flex Time provides students with 30 extra minutes in every academic class each week on a rotating basis.
- **Counselors and Assistant Principals** loop with each grade level to ensure familiarity and positive relationships with students.
- STAR Program is designed for off-grade level students in 7th grade to regain their retained year.

- Take Two is a re-do program that allows all students to Remediation and Acceleration Program: 90 minutes of after school tutoring and mentorship provided by certified teachers.
 - IXL: English IXL subscriptions are used by teachers to scaffold lessons and provide extra practice for
 - Mathia: Online learning program designed to support the Carnegie Learning math curriculum and provide additional practice for students.
 - Math and English intervention classes are available to support academic success in core subjects.

Special Education Resources

- English and Math Inclusion is offered in each grade level to provide special education services in the general education classroom.
- Read 180 is a reading intervention services designed for students below grade level to regain critical reading skills.

RESOURCES TO USE IF A STUDENT IS NOT SUCCEEDING ACADEMICALLY, SOCIALLY OR EMOTIONALLY

- Evaluation Planning Meetings are available to parents/quardians for formal evaluation which may or may not result in the introduction of Special Education Services or a 504 Accommodation Plan.
- Teacher tutoring is available before or after school to review material learned in class. Students should schedule a time with their teacher in advance.
- Peer tutoring may be set up to provide additional academic assistance. Students meet with an assigned peer tutor for four weeks during lunch.
- A parent conference can be set up to discuss classroom performance, behavior, and to formulate ways to get your student back on track.
- The **School Counseling Department** provides students with a range of services including academics, personal/social, and career development.
- A **mental health counselor** from Greater Greenville Mental Health is available to provide counseling to students. A student must be referred to the mental health counselor by a school counselor.
- Through partnerships with the community, students may be paired with an adult mentor to have lunch one day per week.

RESOURCES TO USE IF A STUDENT IS SUCCEEDING ACADEMICALLY, SOCIALLY OR EMOTIONALLY

- Honor societies: National Junior Honor Society and National Junior Beta Club are offered for students who are succeeding academically and meet membership requirements.
- Advanced courses are available at all grade levels including: Math 6/7, Math 7/8, Gifted and Talented English, Algebra 1 Honors, English 1 Honors, Spanish 1 CP, Art 1 CP, Engineering Essentials, Advanced PE, as well as high school credit offerings in all music programs.
- Peer tutors have the opportunity to give back to their school by helping other students who may need additional academic assistance.
- Extracurricular clubs: Student Council, Yearbook, Robotics
